dignity of every living being.

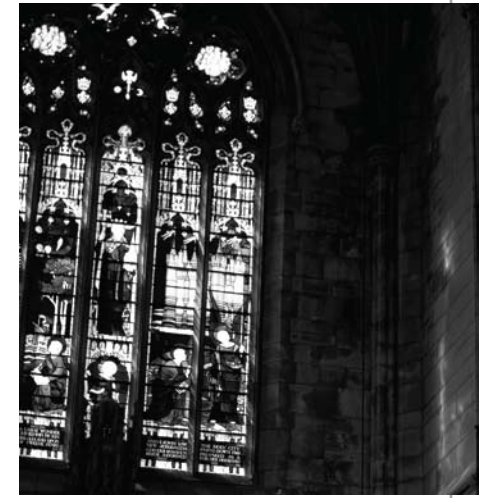

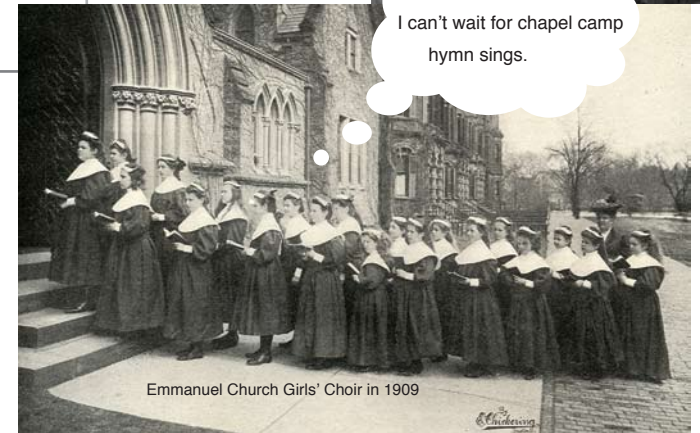
The summer pick-up choir meets each Sunday at 9:00 before the 10:00 service. It's a great group, so don't be shy!
